Please find below additional comments from Redbourne Parish Council from their meeting last night.

The Parish Council strongly object as per previously submitted correspondence (attached again for your info).

Further to this, diseased wheat was delivered to the digester during the summer and sugar beet is currently being delivered and the Parish Council would not have thought these were specifically grown for the biomass facility. Are these categorised as waste? If so should they have the relevant environmental permits as per condition 14 of WD/2012/1336 :-

The energy facility hereby permitted shall only accept non waste plant material as a feedstock - to prevent adverse environmental impact in accordance with planning policies DS1 and DS11 of the NL Local Plan.

Included in the Environmental Agency response to PA WD/2014/1291 as follows:-

If the farming break crops are not being grown specifically for the biomass facility then the feedstock used on site will be categorised as waste. This will result in the facility requiring an environmental permit. If the feedstock is not specifically grown for the site and deemed a waste product, then any spreading of the digestate will also require a land spreading permit.

Nicholas, if you could please let me have comments back on the use of the feed stock please so I can inform the Council of any actions that are to be taken.
