Firstly I would like to thank Wrawby Parish council for setting up the extraordinary meeting held on Wednesday 24th May were a large number of residents attended, the outcome of this meeting was that the Parish Council and Residents objected with a 100% majority to this application.
I believe the North Lincolnshire Council have no alternative but to agree with the views of the residents and their own planning specialist (who are employed by the council to give advice based on their specialist knowledge) by rejecting this proposal outright as it is outside the development line and the consequences and long term affects to this and other village's would be catastrophic for the environment and village way of life. Viewing all of the evidence and objections submitted on the portal I cannot see how the North Lincolnshire

council planning committee can approve this application unless money is talking and the only fair and honest solution would be for it to be rejected outright and If the applicant then wishes to appeal at least it will be taken out of the local teams hands and dealt with independently.

It should also be noted that precedence has already been set by the Inspector to the secretary of state by rejecting two other applications at appeal stage in similar locations so if the council approve this application outside of their own agreed development boundaries they are undermining the decisions made by the Inspectors who operate at a much higher level than the council.
