Description	The modern sluice and lock was built in 1842-44 by Sir John Rennie, on the site of earlier sluices of 1640 and 1769. It separated the New River Ancholme from the tidal River Humber, and incorporated a lock that was crossed by a swing road bridge. This bridge was replaced by a lifting bridge in 1982.

Description	In the Roman period, two parallel roadways were in use both on the chalk wolds and the limestone Lincoln Edge. In each case the trackway along the western escarpment of the hills was accompanied by a road on the dip-slope to the east. Along the Lincoln Edge this latter road was the newly constructed Ermine Street with its northern termination at Old Winteringham; along the Wolds the Barton-Horncastle Roman road ran parallel and to the east of the Prehistoric Middlegate Lane ridgeway.

Description	<p>RB site in Ancholme Valley, near present Ferriby Sluice - features exposed in brickyards this century. Remains found in distinct layer in the clay at a depth of 2.5-3ft., one section records a 2in. layer of "Burnt reddish earth, charcoal and potsherds" at a depth of 2ft. 4ins. (Dudley 1949, 163). Many hearths "formed of stones placed a few inches apart" also found, the latest discovered 1961. "There are 2 stone implements, very much resembling thin stone axes - but the probability is that these were used in the making of the pottery which has been discovered" (Sheppard 1926, 9). "Many fragments of badly warped "waster" pots, usually dishes, found on the site suggested the existence of pottery kilns" (Dudley 1949, 163), no kilns reported found. See also note on saltmaking, SE 993 217, above.</p> <p>Animal bones recovered below level at which RB pottery is found, 1965; SM, SF BB. On the banks of a former creek or stream in the area of clay working a "coracle-like vessel was discovered containing a human skeleton" (Sheppard 1926, 7; Dudley 1949,</p>

	127). The Roman pottery from this site was re-examined by Ian Rowlandson (Community Archaeologist), with the aid of volunteers, in 2007-08. The material was from two main events, the initial brickyard discovery in 1926, and trial trenching by Roger Kipling in 1982. The appraisal confirmed the presence of a kiln on the site, active in the early Roman period before sea level rise led to flooding after c. AD160, although seasonal production may have continued.

Description	A road surface on South Ferriby foreshore was recognised by a local resident 1994. Officers from Humberside Archaeology Unit were informed, who then visited the site and arranged a measured survey of its alignment. It was south east- north west, possibly linking the Romano-British settlements at South Ferriby and Winteringham. The report stated : 'There appeared to be two phases of construction. The first consisted of what appeared to be a layer of brushwood overlying the alluvium. On top of this was a layer of chalk blocks and on top of the chalk was a layer of compacted gravel. The second phase was similarly constructed, but with a greater sand content in the gravel. However, this may have only been a repair to a section of the original road. Sealing this was approximately 2m of estuarine silts. Running along the north side of the road alignment was a possible fence consisting of at least 12 stakes.' A bag of Roman pottery sherds supplied by the original finder were also identified, and were found to be from a burnished and decorated 'blue-grey' ware vessel of the 2nd - early 3rd century AD. [1 - 4] In 1996, the Humber Wetlands project carried out a preservation assessment of the road, which was rapidly eroding.

Other features recorded during erosion of cliff include fireplace of limestone blocks and broken quern-stones, cinerary urns (domestic vessels) near the spring, skeletons near the Hall (SE 988 214), one with a bead necklace. Small finds

	include a flint scraper, IA and RB pottery, thousands of metal objects and coins, La Tene III brooches, IA coins - majority of which are uninscribed South Ferriby type (British KA, KB) Coritanian silver and gold staters from two hoards, others include Gallo- Belgic silver and bronze, Coritanian prototype silver and Coritanian inscribed silver and gold staters. Range of RB brooches, rings, tweezers, keys, styli, spoons etc., "a number of swords, a small lead coffin etc." recorded from gravel pit E of spring. Challis and Harding (1975, I, 165) claim evidence of late IA saltmaking at South Ferriby. Their references clearly relate to South Ferriby Cliff, however, no evidence of salting activity has been recorded from this site. RB material revealed during clay extraction at South Ferriby brickyard suggests some kind of industrial activity - perhaps salt-making, but as specialised equipment generally associated with saltern sites was not recorded, the evidence must be regarded as inconclusive.

Description	<p>The first mention of a bridge crossing the Ancholme at South Ferriby occurs circa 1200 in the Chartulary of Stixwold Priory, where there ia a brief mention of a dispute regarding bridges. In 1338 a grant of Pontage was made for the repair of "the bridge of Southferyby". The calendar of Patent rolls of 1340 gives details of a complaint that the "River between Feriby Brigge and Bishops Brigge" was obstructing shipping. As early as 1288 there is the mention of the already well established use of the Ancolme to allow "ships and boats laden with corn and other things to commodiously pass from the said river Humbre, into the parts of Lindsey". Certainly there was a "brige in Harmit" in 1599, as evidenced by the record of a Manor court that year. There are other records in Court Annals for the years 1288-1483 which show concern for keeping the Ancholme effective for drainage and navigation, but to find the next references to a crossing requires reference to the wills of two villagers recorded in 1531. Both wills give a small sum (half a quarter of barley) towards the "upholdinge of the bryg" and "the brygge warke"</p> <p>In 1586.. the bridge was reported as being "then likewise much decayed."</p> <p>A copy by John Foster of an original map dated 1640 depicts a bridge crossing the Old River. This copy is probably pre 1697. The bridge is shown as having four arches, the main arch being the third in the west-east sequence.</p>

Right return: 2 storeys with 2-storey and attic section to right, 5 bays. Original wing to left has 3 stone steps to French window and single 12-pane sashes to each floor similar to front; later section set back to right has 3 flush 12-pane ground floor sashes under segmental arches, similar sash and tripartite sash to first floor, 2 unequal sashes to attic and stepped and cogged brick eaves cornice. Interior. Stairhall has open well staircase with ramped and wreathed handrail, column newels and balusters, ornate dentilled cornice to lower hall, and modillioned cornice and pair of round-headed doors with radial fanlights in architraves to upper hall. Ground floor central room has moulded dado rail, ornate moulded cornice and marble chimneypiece with reeded surround and frieze with carved panels. Ground floor right wing has ornate moulded cornice and marble chimneypiece with triple half-columns and pulvinated frieze with carved central and side panels. The three main first floor rooms have moulded and dentilled cornices and good chimneypieces with composition ornament, that to centre left particularly ornate. Beaded-panel window-shutters and doors in architraves throughout.</p>
