e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

The trees - Elm1, Elm2 and Ash (see plan) - are located in an area of woodland owned by the Scawby & South Ferriby Estate company known as compartment 101 or Stew Ponds. This low intervention woodland is located on the boundaries of Scawby Park and is the only park woodland component that lies within the Scawby Conservation Area but outside the grounds of Scawby Hall. As such management activity has been less frequent than elsewhere in the park. The three trees that the estate wishes to fell overhang Home Farm yard, which is occupied by a tenant of the Scawby Estate, and more particularly a propane tank used by the tenant. All three trees have suffered significant loss of canopy, through a combination of disease and old age, and are likely to be also suffering from a lowering of the water table in the woodland, which has become noticeably drier in recent years. The applicant proposes felling all three trees backwards into the woodland, removing snagged branches with a polesaw where necessary. We understand that felling the trees is the only way of maintaining the safety of the gas tank and farm workers at Home Farm. Trees have been inspected by the estate's in-house staff, which collectively possesses

nine decades of experience in managing trees. The estate only consents to carry out work on trees where there is a reasonable fear of damage to property.
