**North Lincolnshire Council** hereby gives notice that the application received on 30/03/2022 for:

**Planning permission to make alterations to the detached garage to form an annexe dwelling space and to extend the dropped kerb to the parking area at The Hawk, New Holland Road, Barrow Upon Humber, DN19 7EF**

has been considered and that permission for this development in accordance with the plans and written particulars submitted has been granted subject to the following conditions and reasons:

1.

The development must be begun before the expiration of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason

To comply with section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

2.

The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans:

- Location Plan - 0985-EA-A-P001;
- Proposed Plans and Elevations - 0985-EA-A-P003.

Reason

For the avoidance of doubt and in the interests of proper planning.

3.

The existing vehicular access to the site shall be improved within highway limits in accordance with details to be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority.

Reason

In the interests of highway safety and to comply with policies T2 and T19 of the North Lincolnshire Local Plan.

4.

No loose material shall be placed on any driveway or parking area within 10 metres of the adopted highway unless measures are taken in accordance with details to be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority to prevent the material from spilling onto the highway. Once agreed and implemented these measures shall be retained.

Reason

In the interests of highway safety and to comply with policy T19 of the North Lincolnshire Local Plan.

5.

The proposed new vehicle parking facility shall not be brought into use until the vehicular access serving it has been completed within highway limits.

Reason

In the interests of highway safety and to comply with policy T19 of the North Lincolnshire Local Plan.

6.

No development shall take place until details showing an effective method of preventing surface water run-off from hard paved areas within the site onto the highway have been approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. These facilities shall be implemented prior to the access and parking facilities being brought into use and thereafter so retained.

Reason

In the interests of highway safety and to comply with policy T19 of the North Lincolnshire Councils Local Plan & Policies CS18 and CS19 of the North Lincolnshire Councils Core Strategy and paragraph 163 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

7.

No development shall take place until details showing an effective method of preventing surface water run-off from the highway onto the developed site is submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. These facilities shall be implemented prior to the access and parking facilities being brought into use and thereafter so retained.

Reason

To prevent the increased risk of flooding to themselves and others, to improve and protect water quality, and to ensure the implementation and future maintenance of the sustainable drainage structures in accordance with Policy DS16 of the North Lincolnshire Councils Local Plan & Policies CS18 and CS19 of the North Lincolnshire Councils Core Strategy and paragraphs 155, 157, 163 & 165 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

### Appeals to the Secretary of State

- If you are aggrieved by the decision of your local planning authority to refuse permission for the proposed development or to grant it subject to conditions, then you can appeal to the Secretary of State under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- If you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision then you must do so within 6 months of the date of this notice.
- If this is a decision on a planning application relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as is already the subject of an enforcement notice and if you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within 28 days of the date of this notice.
- If an enforcement notice is served relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as in your application and if you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within 28 days of the date of service of the enforcement notice, or within 6 months [12 weeks in the case of a householder appeal] of the date of this notice, whichever period expires earlier

### Please note however:

If your application was for **householder development** (dwelling house extensions, alterations, garages, swimming pools, walls, fences, vehicular access, porches, satellite dishes etc) or for a minor commercial application then you must do so **within 12 weeks** of the date of this notice.

- The Secretary of State need not consider an appeal if it seems to him that the local planning authority could not have granted planning permission for the proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions they imposed, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of any development order and to any directions given under a development order.
- If you intend to submit an appeal that you would like examined by inquiry then you must notify the Local Planning Authority and Planning Inspectorate ([inquiryappeals@planninginspectorate.gov.uk](mailto:inquiryappeals@planninginspectorate.gov.uk)) at least 10 days before submitting the appeal. ### Purchase Notices

- If either the local planning authority or the Secretary of State refuses permission to develop land or grants it subject to conditions, the owner may claim that he can neither put the land to a reasonably beneficial use in its existing state nor render the land capable of a reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted.
- In these circumstances, the owner may serve a purchase notice on the council in whose area the land is situated. This notice will require the council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Part V1 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
