Further to the email response to this amended planning application that my colleague sent in May and your email below, I have reviewed our data and provide the following information in respect of existing pupil numbers and projected numbers.

#### **PRIMARY**

This development falls within the catchment area of Scawby Academy.

The latest verified census data (January 2022) shows the school has 207 pupils on roll against a capacity of 210. All years groups are full to PAN with the exception of the current Year 3 and Year 6. The school was oversubscribed for the September 2022 reception intake, meaning that whilst an under PAN cohort will leave in July 2022, a full cohort will start in Reception and the only year group with any spaces available will be Year 4. It will take 7 years for the Reception cohort 2022 to progress through the school and move into the secondary sector.

There are several housing developments in the catchment area of Scawby Academy that precede this application and will further impact on pupil numbers.

#### **SECONDARY**

This development falls with the catchment area of Sir John Nelthorpe School (SJN), but for the purposes of developer contributions we have also considered spaces available at The Vale Academy (Vale). Both schools are located in Brigg and North Lincolnshire Council transport policy currently provides free transport to either school for those young people living more than 3 miles from the school, in either school catchment area.

The latest verified census data (January 2022) shows that: SJN has 724 pupils on roll in years 7-11 against a capacity of 770; and Vale has 684 pupils on roll in years 7-11 against a capacity of 810 places. On further analysis, the spaces available are predominately in the two older cohorts that will leave in June 2022 and June 2023, before this development is occupied. The breakdown is: Year 7 – 13 places; Year 8 – 27 places; Year 9 – 8 places; Year 10 – 70 places; and Year 11 – 54 places.

The projections show that we anticipate both schools to be full to capacity, larger cohorts of pupils will enter the secondary sector over the next few years compared to those leaving. There are 21 separate housing developments, predating this application, that fall in the catchment areas of the two Brigg schools. The majority of the developments are in the catchment area of SJN.

I hope that this clarifies our position in respect of the request for developer contributions towards education provision.
