Please find this morning's update on the "disgraceful ongoing mess" created by Woodyfuel on Holmes Lane.

Woodchip was blowing into my eyes from the grader as I took the photographs the noise & permeating smell of wood is disgusting the noise of the bucket scraping up booming into the countryside disturbing Residents quality of life.

Before Christmas Julie Nundy of Animal Heaven Boarding Kennel's over 80year old father-in-law dug out the verge grips to alleviate the massive pools of water obscuring the depth of the "crater's" created by these 25-30tonne walking floor lorry's so easy for normal vehicles to damage wheels of which I believe has already happened.

I don't really know why he bothered as the verges are so churned up it's impossible to see the good he did.....

I believe that since the PA to vary conditions of operating hours & increase tonnage from 13,000T to 50,000T was validated in October 2024 this company have already been working as if they have been granted Planning Permission.

With an average of x7 Lorries a day over 6 working day's it is not difficult to work out the output..... if this was still an agricultural operation a "road sweeper & wheel wash" would be a daily essential.

I would like to see the Proposed Road Layout Plans on an already dangerous crossroads onto a Country Lane with at least

x1 fatality I personally have been expected to reverse onto Ermine Street blind when these Lorries cannot enter or exit the facility because they are rammed onsite and blocking the lane.

I do not want the Give-away Island removing even though they have virtually destroyed it as this serves as a protection for other vehicles turning into or exiting Holmes Lane.

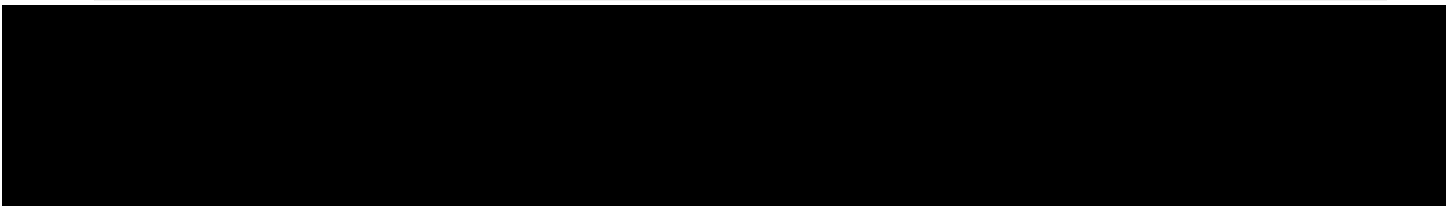
In my opinion this Company is in the wrong place having outgrown a site that should never have been given PP in the
