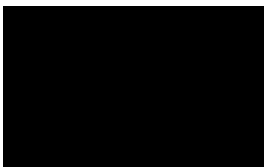
North Lincolnshire Council hereby gives notice that the application received on 09/01/2026 for:

Notice of intention to fell Magnolia identified as T1, Thin crown of Sycamore identified as T2, Prune two Limes to reduce height identified as T3 AND T4, Fell Ivy Ball identified as T5 all within Barton upon Humber Conservation Area - New Hall, 2 Newport, Barton upon Humber, DN18 5QJ

On this occasion the council has decided not to make a Tree Preservation Order. You may therefore carry out the work described, providing that it is completed within two years. It is recommended that the work is completed in accordance with British Standard *BS3998: Tree Work; Recommendations 2010*.

Nesting Birds and Bats When pruning or felling trees or hedgerows you should ensure the work does not disturb or injure nesting birds. These, and their nests when in use, are protected from disturbance or injury under the 1981 Wildlife and Countryside Act. Ideally carry out work outside the main breeding season (1 March to 1 September). In addition it is important to survey trees for bats, particularly if they are mature trees with suitable cracks or holes that are likely to be affected by the work. All species of bat are protected under Schedule 5 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended) and Schedule 2 of The Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2017, making all species of bat European Protected Species.

Any person responsible for carrying out the works authorised by this notice is advised to engage the services of a qualified contractor in order to ensure an acceptable level of competence and that appropriate public liability insurance arrangements are in place.

The proposed tree works will require a level of traffic management to be used within highway limits. Before any works are commenced on site you should contact the highway authority on telephone number 01724 297319 to arrange for the necessary consents.

YOUR RIGHTS OF APPEAL

If you are unhappy with the decision of the council to refuse this application, or to grant consent subject to conditions, an appeal may be made to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS).

You must appeal in writing within 28 days of receiving the decision notice. Only in special circumstances will you be granted a longer period.
