Hi Deborah, I hope you are keeping well. I'm sorry we haven't caught up yet but life is so busy!

I'm sad to tell you that [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] After many years of service to Kirmington he has decided to step down as Parish Council Chairman. He will remain as vice chair and he wants to carry on organising Remembrance Day in the village.

Our new Chairman is Steve [REDACTED] who would like to continue the good relationship we have with Humberside Airport. He noted that we no longer receive monthly noise monitoring reports so we discussed the issue of aircraft noise and your previous desire to request a change to the S106 requirement to monitor noise.

We agreed that breaches of noise limitations were rare and that the airport is a good neighbour therefore we do not object to the cessation of noise monitoring. We are aware that modern aircraft are becoming less noisy and that noisy aircraft are either military or heritage aircraft both of which are welcomed by most residents.

We would therefore prefer to have an informal arrangement whereby we can raise concerns with the airport should any arise.

A resident recently complained to you about a light aircraft flying low over the village. I explained why this occurs occasionally during training and that there is no hazard. He accepted my explanation so please feel free to refer to that conversation if you haven't responded yet.

Steve [REDACTED] said that he would like to strengthen the relationship between residents and the airport and asked if it might be possible to organise an open event later this summer. If that were possible I would be happy to discuss what might be achieved.

[REDACTED] is also coming off the Airport Consultative Committee so [REDACTED] will represent the parish council going forward.
