PUBLIC HEALTH OUTCOMES PROFILE 2016/17 ASHBY AND BOTTESFORD - ASHBY CHILDREN'S CENTRE

This profile provides a brief picture of public health outcomes for mothers and under 5s in the Ashby Children's Centre catchment area for 2016/17. This data, combined with service reach and activity data, should help agencies understand what factors are driving health improvement in this local population and enable the allocation and prioritisation of resources effectively. Each profile contains information on the child population in each catchment area, wider determinants of health and indicators of maternal and child health




- locality with the catchment including parts of Ashby and Kingsway with Lincoln Gardens wards.
- 789 under 5s live in this catchment area which represents just over 8% of all under 5s in North Lincolnshire.
- The adult population of this area have significantly poorer than average health with male and female life expectancy below the local and national average.
- This catchment has relatively high levels of child poverty. Over half (53%) of the under 5 population live in the 30% most deprived output areas of England and nearly 19% of children under 16 live in households in receipt of out of work benefits, which is significantly higher than average for North Lincolnshire and England.
- The number of births in the area to mothers born outside of the UK was slightly lower than average for North Lincolnshire, at 14.6%.

- Ashby Children's Centre is located in Scunthorpe South The area has below average breastfeeding initiation rates and low continuation of breastfeeding rates with just over 10% of babies totally or partially breastfed at 6-8 weeks, which is a quarter of the rate seen nationally.
 - The percentage of women booking late is lower than average.
 - Smoking in pregnancy remains high here at over twice the national average.
 - Births to women under 20 were higher than seen in North Lincolnshire overall, but not significantly.
 - The rate of A&E attendances in the area is significantly higher than average for North Lincolnshire, though has fallen since 2015-16.








DATA TRENDS 2012-2013 to 2016-2017








Recent Progress

- The proportion of women smoking in pregnancy has not changed significantly since over the past 5 years, and remains above the North Lincolnshire average.
- The rate of live births in the area has been very close to the North Lincolnshire average for the past 3 years, and has remained relatively stable in terms of numbers.
- Breastfeeding initiation in the area is below average, although not significantly, and has remained relatively unchanged over the last 5 years, dipping very slightly in 2014/15.
- The percentage of children achieving a good level of development at age 5 has been either above or very close to the North Lincolnshire rate over the past 4 years, and is currently slightly higher.
