




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PUBLIC HEALTH OUTCOMES PROFILE 2016/17 BARTON RURAL CHILDREN'S CENTRE

This profile provides a brief picture of public health outcomes for mothers and under 5s in the Barton Rural Children's Centre catchment area for 2016/17. This data, combined with service reach and activity data, should help agencies understand what factors are driving health improvement in this local population and enable the allocation and prioritisation of resources effectively. Each profile contains information on the child population in each catchment area, wider determinants of health and indicators of maternal and child health




- Barton Rural Children's Centre is located in Barton and
 District locality with the catchment being coterminous with Barton and Ferry wards.
- In population terms the catchment is the largest in North Lincolnshire. 1178 under 5s live here which represents 12.4% of all under 5s in North Lincolnshire.
- The adult population of this area have average health, with male and female life expectancy in line with the local average.
- This area has lower than average levels of child poverty although there is variation within the catchment. Less than 1 in 5 children reside in output areas that fall within England's 30% most deprived neighbourhoods and just under 16% of under 16s live in a household in receipt of out of work benefits, which is similar to the overall percentage for North Lincolnshire.
- The number of births to women born outside of the UK is significantly lower than average for North Lincolnshire.

- The rates of admission for accidental injuries in under 5s, and A&E attendances for under 5s are the lowest in North Lincolnshire.
- The proportion of children with excess weight at 5 and 11 years of age are broadly in line with the North Lincolnshire averages.
- The proportion of women who 'book late' in this catchment is the lowest in North Lincolnshire
- The rate of smoking in pregnancy is significantly above the national average although only slightly above the local rate.
- Births to women under 20 are below the North Lincolnshire average.
- The percentage of children ready for school at age 5 is significantly higher than the national average.











DATA TRENDS 2012-2013 to 2016-2017









Recent Progress

- The proportion of women smoking at the point of delivery has increased slightly in the last 5 years, and has been above the North Lincolnshire average for the last three years, although not significantly.
- The birth rate in the area increased slightly in the last three years and is now very similar to the average for North Lincolnshire.
- The rate of breastfeeding initiation is relatively stable at just slightly above the North Lincolnshire rate.
- The percentage of children ready for school at age 5 has increased nearly 11 percentage points in 4 years and is above the North Lincolnshire average.
