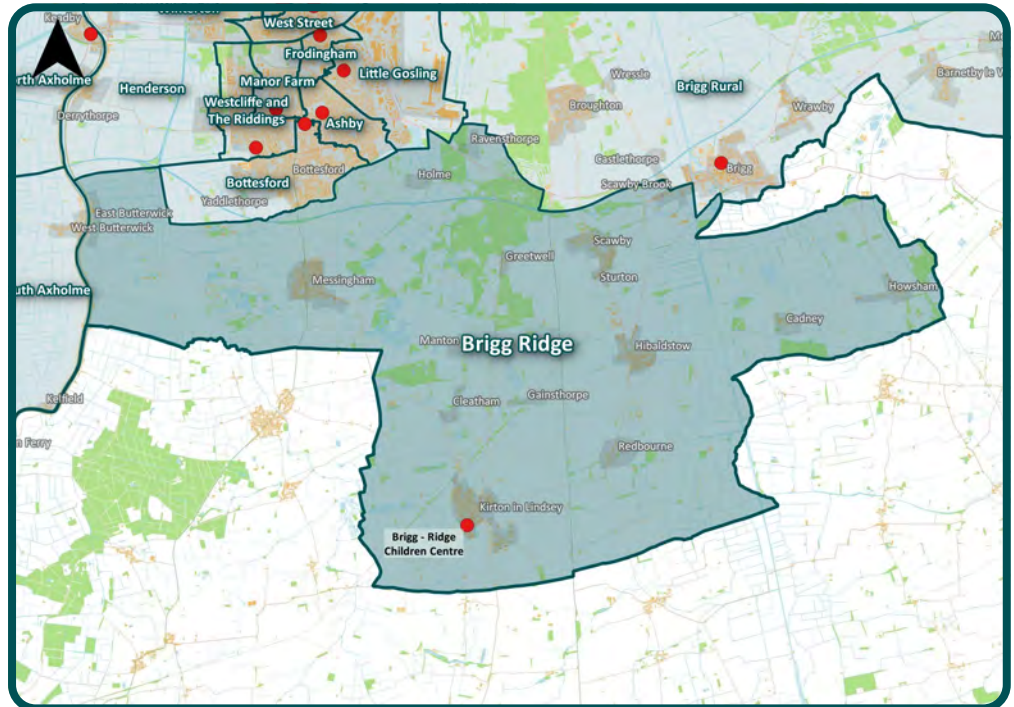


# PUBLIC HEALTH OUTCOMES PROFILE 2016/17

## BRIGG RIDGE CHILDREN'S CENTRE

This profile provides a brief picture of public health outcomes for mothers and under 5s in the Brigg Ridge Children's Centre catchment area for 2016/17. This data, combined with service reach and activity data, should help agencies understand what factors are driving health improvement in this local population and enable the allocation and prioritisation of resources effectively. Each profile contains information on the child population in each catchment area, wider determinants of health and indicators of maternal and child health















- Brigg Ridge Children's Centre is located in Brigg and District locality and the catchment area is coterminous with Ridge ward.
- 541 under 5s live in this catchment area which represents just under 6% of all under 5s in North Lincolnshire.
- The adult population of this area enjoy better than average health with female life expectancy significantly above the local average at 84.9 years.
- This area has lower than average levels of child poverty with none of the small areas falling within the top 30% most deprived in England, in addition less than 1 in 10 children under 16 live in a household in receipt of out of work benefits.
- The percentage of births to women born outside of the UK is significantly lower than average for North Lincolnshire.
- The percentage of children ready for school at age 5 is the second highest Children's Centre area.
- The rate of smoking in pregnancy is significantly below the local average and also below average for England
- The rate of attendance for A&E in under 5s is significantly lower than the North Lincolnshire average.
- The rate of admissions for respiratory tract infections was the highest of any area, although the rate is not significantly higher than North Lincolnshire and the numbers involved are relatively small.
- Percentages of children with excess weight at 5 and 11 years of age are lower than the North Lincolnshire average.
- The rate of Children in Need (0-10) in the area is significantly lower than average.

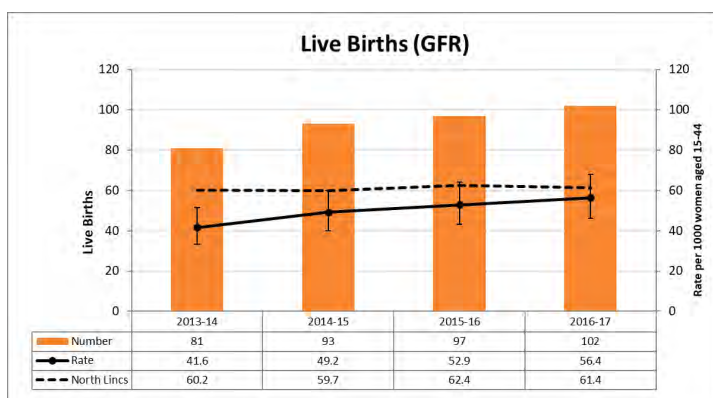

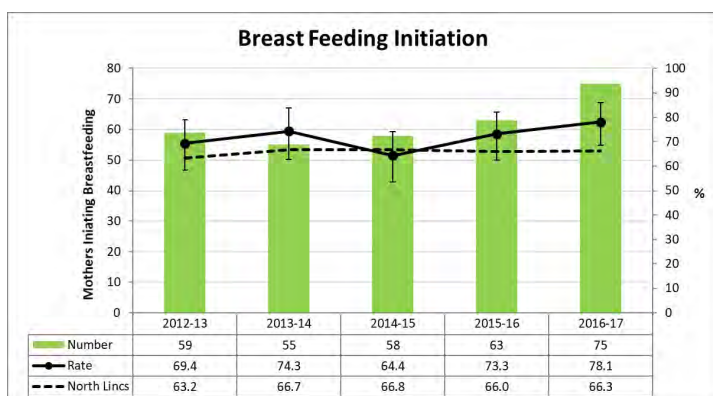
## BRIGG RIDGE CHILDREN'S CENTRE

### DATA TRENDS 2012-2013 to 2016-2017



### Recent Progress

- The proportion of women smoking in pregnancy remains relatively unchanged between 2012-13 and 2016-17 with a slight increase in 2015/16. At 9.4% it is significantly lower than average for North Lincolnshire.
- The rate of births in the area has increased year on year between 2013-14 and 2016-17 and although currently below, is moving closer to the North Lincolnshire average.
- Breastfeeding Initiation rates have on the whole increased between 2012-13 and 2016-17 and excluding 2014-15, have been above the North Lincolnshire average, although not significantly.
- The percentage of children ready for school at age 5 has fluctuated in the last 4 years, but has increased overall by over 13 percentage points.
