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


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Barton Rural Children's Centre Profile 2023

Part of the North Lincolnshire JSNA

This profile provides a brief picture of public health outcomes for mothers and under 5s in the Barton Rural Children's Centre catchment area for 2023. This information. combined with service reach and activity data, should help agencies understand what factors are driving health improvement in this local population and enable the allocation and prioritisation of resources effectively. The profile contains information on the child population residing in its catchment area, wider determinants of health and indicators of maternal and child health.



- Barton Rural Children's Centre is located in Barton and District locality with the catchment being coterminous with Barton and Ferry wards.
- Barton catchment has the largest number of residents with an estimated 1040 under 5s which represents 12% of all under 5s in North Lincolnshire; nearly a third (30%) of women are of child bearing age and mothers born outside of the UK are very low in number.
- The population is generally healthy with both male and female life expectancy similar to both the local and national averages.
- This area has a few pockets of child poverty with a quarter of under 5s residing in England's 30% most deprived neighbourhoods; about a fifth of u16s either live in relative low income or are eligible for free school meals.
- The rate of children achieving a good level of development at 2 ½ and school readiness at 5 years are amongst the highest in North Lincolnshire whilst GCSE attainment in English and Maths is about average.

- The fertility rate, premature births, smoking at delivery and breastfeeding initiation are all close to local and national averages whilst late bookings, deliveries to women of minority ethnic backgrounds, births to under 20s and low weight births are below average.
- Just over a fifth of 5 years olds and a third of 11 year olds carry excess weight which for 11 year olds is broadly in line with the local and national average values
- Under 5 residents of Barton catchment area tend to have below average admissions for respiratory infections and visits to Accident and Emergency along with average levels of injury admissions amongst under 15s year olds.



Life Expectancy (2019-21)










All numbers are rounded to nearest 5. Higher rate values can be categorised as (a) higher than average; (b) worse than average; (c) better than average.
