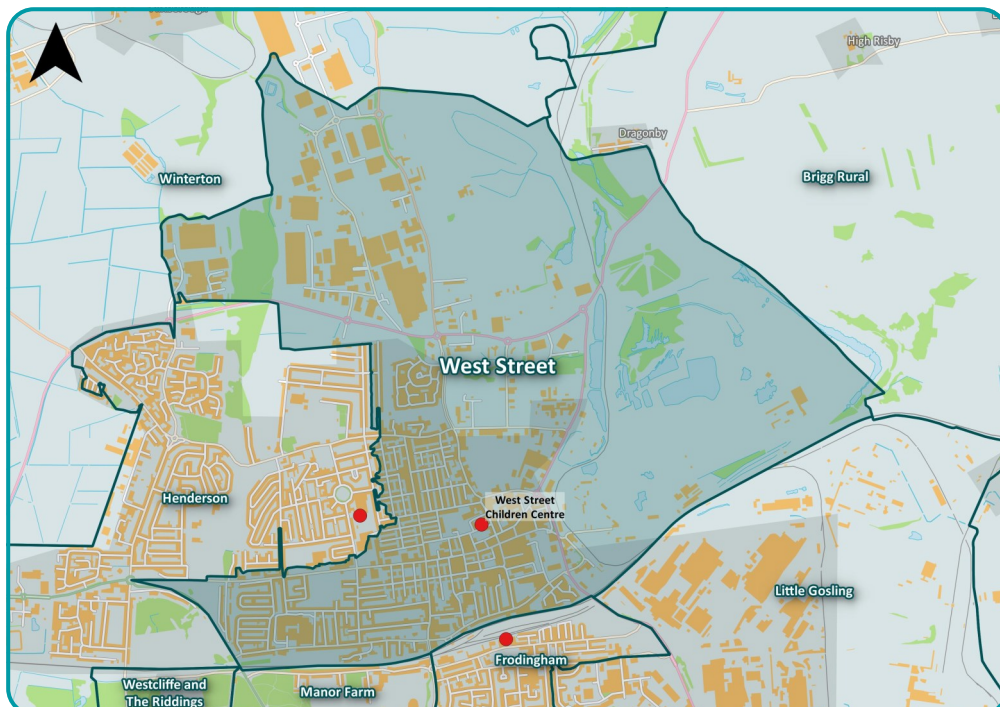




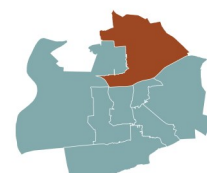
# West Street Children's Centre Profile 2023

## Part of the North Lincolnshire JSNA

This profile provides a brief picture of public health outcomes for mothers and under 5s in the West Street Children's Centre catchment area for 2023. This information, combined with service reach and activity data, should help agencies understand what factors are driving health improvement in this local population and enable the allocation and prioritisation of resources effectively. The profile contains information on the child population residing in its catchment area, wider determinants of health and indicators of maternal and child health.



- West Street Children's Centre is located in Scunthorpe North locality with the catchment including parts of Crosby and Park and Town wards.
- An estimated 935 under 5s live in this catchment area, which is about 11% of all under 5s in North Lincolnshire; nearly half (45%) of resident women are of child bearing age.
- The adult population of this area have relatively poor general health with the lowest male and female life expectancy in North Lincolnshire and significantly below the local and national average.
- Child poverty in the area is high with over two thirds (69%) of under 5's living in England's 30% most deprived neighbourhoods; 38% of resident children live in relative low income, a quarter (26%) are eligible for free school meals and 17% of households claim Universal Credit.
- The area has the second highest fertility rate in North Lincolnshire, the highest percentage of mothers born outside the UK or with a minority ethnic background and one of the highest numbers of births to women under 20; it also has the highest number of maternity bookings.
- The proportion of women who 'book late' in this area is the highest in North Lincolnshire; in contrast, the area has the lowest percentage of women booking with a BMI over 30, significantly lower than the local average.
- The breastfeeding initiation rate (74%) is one of the highest in North Lincolnshire whilst smoking at delivery and low birth weight rates are similar to the North Lincolnshire average.
- The percentage of children ready for school at age 5 and GCSE attainment in English and maths are amongst the lowest in North Lincolnshire with average levels of children scoring above threshold in all 5 domains at 2½ years.
- Two out of five (41%) 11 year old children carry excess weight which is the highest proportion in North Lincolnshire and an increase since 2016/17.
- Accident and Emergency attendances are the second highest in North Lincolnshire and significantly above average

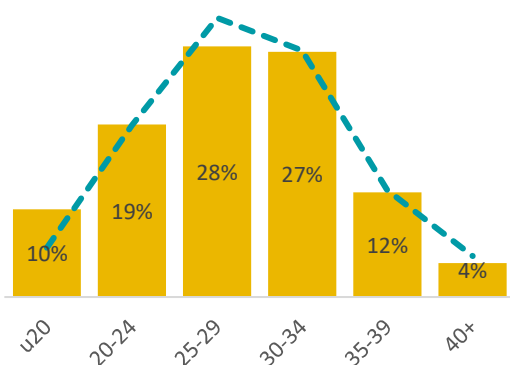

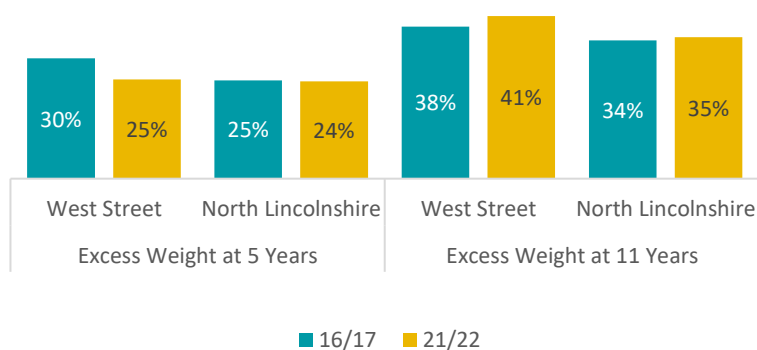
### Mothers Age at Delivery

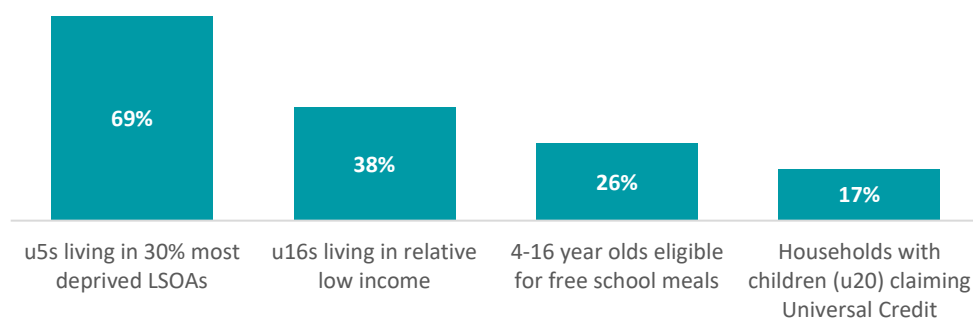
## EXCESS WEIGHT
