




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# PUBLIC HEALTH OUTCOMES PROFILE 2016/17 HENDERSON CHILDREN'S CENTRE

This profile provides a brief picture of public health outcomes for mothers and under 5s in the Henderson Children's Centre catchment area for 2016/17. This data, combined with service reach and activity data, should help agencies understand what factors are driving health improvement in this local population and enable the allocation and prioritisation of resources effectively. Each profile contains information on the child population in each catchment area, wider determinants of health and indicators of maternal and child health




- Henderson Children's Centre is located in Scunthorpe North locality with the catchment including parts of Burringham and Gunness, Burton Upon Stather and Winterton, Crosby and Park and Town wards.
- 862 under 5s live in this catchment area which represents just over 9% of all under 5s in North Lincolnshire.
- The adult population of this area have lower health outcomes compared to the North Lincolnshire average, with female life expectancy significantly lower.
- This area has higher than average levels of child poverty. Almost 40% reside in output areas that fall within England's 30% most deprived neighbourhoods and nearly 18% of under 16s live in a household in receipt of out of work benefits.
- 30% of births in the area are to mothers born outside of the UK, and 36% of deliveries were to BME mothers, both of which are significantly higher than the North Lincolnshire rates.

- The number of births to women resident in this area are above average but have fallen compared with the previous year.
- The proportion of women who 'book late' in pregnancy is above average here although not significantly.
- The rate of A&E attendances in under 5s is significantly higher than for North Lincolnshire and is the second highest for Children's Centre areas in North Lincolnshire.
- The breastfeeding initiation rate is in line with the North Lincolnshire average, although the continuation rate is slightly below, though not significantly.
- The proportion of children with excess weight at 11 years is significantly higher than the England rate and second highest overall Children's Centre area.








### **Recent Progress**

- The rate of smoking at delivery has fluctuated, from relative lows in 2012-13 and 2014-15 and increasing between 2014-15 and 2016-17, to slightly above the rate of North Lincolnshire.
- The rate of births in the area has increased since 2013 -14, and is now higher than the North Lincolnshire rate, though not significantly.
- Breastfeeding initiation rates in this area have mostly stayed in line with the North Lincolnshire rate, with a fall in 2015-16 which was within confidence intervals and not significant.
- Readiness for school at age 5 has declined slightly in 2016-17 and is below average, though not significantly.
