




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PUBLIC HEALTH OUTCOMES PROFILE 2016/17 WESTCLIFF AND THE RIDDINGS CHILDREN'S CENTRE


This profile provides a brief picture of public health outcomes for mothers and under 5s in the Westcliff and The Riddings Children's Centre catchment area for 2016/17. This data, combined with service reach and activity data, should help agencies understand what factors are driving health improvement in this local population and enable the allocation and prioritisation of resources effectively. Each profile contains information on the child population in each catchment area, wider determinants of health and indicators of maternal and child health



- Westcliff and The Riddings Children's Centre is located Over 1 in 3 women smoke in pregnancy, which is in Scunthorpe South locality with the catchment encompassing Brumby ward and Ashby Parklands.
- 990 under 5s live in this catchment area which represents just over 10% of all under 5s in North Lincolnshire.
- Health outcomes for adults living in this area are poor with male and female life expectancy lower than average, and female life expectancy the lowest of any Children's Centre area, at more than 3 years below average.
- More than 4 out of 5 children living in this catchment reside in output areas that rank amongst England's 30% most deprived. Nearly 30% of Children live in a household in receipt of out work benefits which is over twice the national average, and the highest in North LinconIshire.
- The proportion of births to women born outside of the UK is slightly above average and rising.

- significantly above the North Lincolnshire average and over three times the national average.
- Births to women under 20 are falling, however they are the highest in North Lincolnshire and remain significantly above the national average.
- The area has the highest rate of women booking with a BMI over 30, and is significantly higher than average.
- Breastfeeding initiation rates are significantly below average and are the lowest of any centre catchment in North Lincolnshire. Breastfeeding continuation rates are also low.
- The proportion of children with excess weight at age 5 is significantly higher than average, and over 10 percentage points higher than the England rate.





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




DATA TRENDS 2012-2013 to 2016-2017









Recent Progress

- Smoking in pregnancy rates have fluctuated since 2012-13 and have seen an overall slight increase. In 2016-17 the gap between the area and North Lincolnshire was nearly 17 percentage points.
- The proportion of live births in the area has declined very slightly over the past 4 years, and remains above average.
- Breastfeeding initiation rates have improved since 2012-13 but remain significantly below the local authority average.
- The proportion of children assessed as ready for school at 5 years of age is improving, and has moved closer to the North Lincolnshire average.
